Bilbao tourist map pdf

Written by Lisa AlexanderMay 31, 2019 When The Guggenheim Museum of Frank Gehry appeared along the shore of a provincial town in the north of Spain, a place previously ignored by the tourism industry, a new phenomenon in tourism was born: the architecturalism, describing the niche of travelers who choose destinations for their famous modern architectural works. A related term, 'DeL effect', was born from this too, as the city's economy flourished with the influx of visitors flocking to Bilbao just to see this famous museum of contemporary art, which dazzles with its innovative modern architecture and vast collection. The Basque Country is famous for its gastronomic tradition, and Bilbao is no exception - this is the place to be if you want to experience pintxos, a unique Basque touch on tapas. The city has five Michelin-starred restaurants, serving the best cuisine in exceptional dining rooms. Two of the restaurants are located in the main tourist attractions: the Nerua restaurant at the Guggenheim Museum and the Exanobe restaurant at Palacio Euskalduna. See also: Where to stay in Bilbao Jeff Koons' puppy at the Guggenheim Museum Most tourists visiting Bilbao make a beeline at the Guggenheim Museum, the unmissable view of the city. The building itself is a spectacular work of art and is considered a revolutionary example of 20th century architecture. It was designed by renowned architect Frank Gehry, using advanced software from the aerospace industry, and was built between 1993 and 1997. The elegant, swirling, sculpture-shaped structure paves the way for a memorable experience of appreciation of art. Inside the building, 24,000 square metres of exhibition space display the artworks in an inspiring setting. In the Atrium, the central interior room that is an emblematic feature of Gehry's architecture, paintings are displayed along the walls of the curved walkway in a three-level staircase. Giant windows allow natural light, showing art to the best advantage. From the Atrium, the museum's 20 galleries display the rest of the vast collection in smaller rooms. Highlights of the exhibitions include an abstract work by Mark Rothko; colorful painting Borghese villa by Willem de Kooning; Only with wind, time, and sound and sunflowers by Anselm Kiefer; Christian Boltanski's assortment of human photographs; the group of 17 paintings in Francesco Clemente's mother's room; Three Spanish red sculptures of Venus by Jim Dine; and The Radeau of Jellyfish Painting by José Manuel Ballester. The facilities the most remarkable in the museum are the nine-metre-high spider sculpture called Maman by Louise Bourgeois and the gigantic topiary dog full of flowers called Puppy, the work of Jeff Koons. Those who want to explore the attraction with an expert can get a 1.5 hour private tour of the Guggenheim Guggenheim Museum, which includes admission to the museum and a narrative that explains the stories behind many of the museum's most famous works of art. Address: 2 Avenida Abandoibarra, Bilbao Official website: Bilbao Museum of Fine Arts The Museum of Fine Arts in Bilbao offers an exceptional collection housed in two separate buildings. The historic building features works by European masters from the 14th to the 17th centuries. Dutch and Flemish paintings from the 15th to the 17th centuries are well represented, with masterpieces such as Quentin Matsys' Money Changers and Dirk Bouts' Virgin and Child, as well as works by Anthony van Dyck and Vos from the 17th century Flemish school. Spanish paintings from the 14th and 15th centuries include paintings by Jaime Huguet, Bartolomé Bermejo and Pedro Serra. The assortment of Spanish paintings from the 16th to the 17th century presents the Annunciation of El Greco, Virgin and Child with Saint John of Zurbaron, as well as works by Velzquez and Jusepe de Ribera. Another highlight is Francisco de Goya's portrait of Fernandez de Moraton. The collection also covers Italian paintings from the 16th to 17th centuries and 19th-century French paintings, including the Washers of Arles de Gauguin, as well as Romanesque and Gothic sculptures. An entire floor is devoted to the works of Basque artists, including 22 paintings by the landscape designer Dario de Regoyos (the largest collection of his works in any museum). The museum's modern building features mainly works by contemporary Spanish artists. One of Bilbao's Michelin-starred restaurants is close to the museum. Restaurante Zortziko (17 Calle Alameda Mazarredo) serves innovative haute cuisine with breathtaking presentations. Address: 2 Plaza del Museo, Bilbao Official site: Casco Viejo (Old Town) Full of old-world charm, the Casco Viejo is on the right bank of the river stretching between the san Antonio Bridge and the church of San Nicols. The old town is connected by five bridges with the New Town (Ensanche). The core of Casco Viejo is located around the Siete Calles (Seven Streets): Somera, Artecalle, Tendera, Belosticalle, Carnicera Vieja, Barrencalle, and Barrencalle Barena. Exploring the picturesque historic streets lined with attractive shops and cafes is one of the most popular things to do in Bilbao. In the northern part of the old town around the Puente del Arenal is the Paseo del Arenal, the main artery of this part of Bilbao. Nearby, on the Plaza de Arriaga, is the Teatro Arriaga, an elegant neo-baroque theatre inspired by the Palais Garnier Opera house in Paris. Built in 1890 and later renovated, the Arriaga Theatre is the cultural centre of the city, where classical music concerts, operas and theatre performances are held. Another point of view important in the Casco Viejo is the Iglesia de San Nicols de Bari. This beautiful church has a baroque façade and a unique octagon-shaped interior; the church dates from the century, but was completely rebuilt in 1756. The beautiful carved altar and some of the paintings are the work of Juan de Mena. Just next to St. Nicholas Church is Plaza Nueva (also known as Plaza Barria), a bustling space that is an attraction in its own right. This walking tour of Bilbao's old quarter is a great way to get an insight into the layout and history of the area, led by a professional guide. The Volantin Bridge by Antonio Calatrave Copyright Photo: Stillman Rodgers Some of the most stunning views of Bilbao are of La Salve Bridge, an architectural and artistic masterpiece in itself that houses The Red Arc (The Red Arc), designed by French artist Daniel Buren in honor of the Guggenheim's 10th anniversary. It crosses the estuary right next to the museum complex, and pedestrians can access the bridge observation platforms by elevator to look down on the building and its grounds for breathtaking views, perfect picture of the Guggenheim. A few blocks away, tourists will find the Zubizuri foot bridge, a beautiful suspension bridge, also called the Campo Volantin footbridge, named after its designer Santio Calatrava. The bridge has become an icon of the city, stretching across the estuary in an arc, sweeping motion, and features a glass terrace. To the north of the city, at the entrance to the estuary, the vizcaya Bridge is a UNESCO World Heritage Site built in 1893 during the Industrial Revolution, designed by Alberto Palacio. It is famous for its engineering and historical architecture, being the first bridge to use a combination of steel and iron cables. A quiet corner in Plaza Nueva, Bilbao Photo Copyright: Stillman Rodgers Plaza Nueva (also known as Plaza Barria) is a neoclassical city square built in the mid-19th century. The square is surrounded by elegant arcaded buildings with shops and restaurants, a great place to discover pintxos. Pintxos is a typically Basque version of tapas, named after their presentation - every bite or snack the size of a dish is served on a toothpick or skewer. They are also called pinchos, the Spanish word for spike. Like tapas, tourists who want to discover a wide range of local goodies can easily jump from one café to another, order a sample, and then move on. Plaza Nueva is also the place where you can find city festivals and farmers markets, and is a popular meeting place for tourists and locals. It is also the site of a unique but bizarre historical event; in 1872, when the Duke of Savoy visited the city, the square was barricaded with sandbags and filled with water, so that the gondolas could float inside in his honour. A representing the unusual event can be found at the Museum of Fine Arts in Bilbao. Euskal Museoa Bilbao (Museo Vasco) Fernando Jiménez / modified photo At the Euskal Museoa Bilbao (Bilbao Basque Museum), also called the Museo Vasco in Spanish, visitors can discover the unique culture and history of the Basque region. Housed in a beautiful beautiful Building in the heart of the Casco Viejo (old town), the museum has three different departments that document the Basque way of life: archaeology, ethnography, and history. The archaeology section presents prehistoric discoveries from sites in the Basque Country, such as commemorative stones and sculptures. One of the most prized objects in the collection is a mysterious idol of Mikeldi. The ethnography department presents Basque crafts and folk art. One of the rooms presents an interesting pattern of relief representing the Basque provinces. The history department is mainly devoted to the history of Bilbao and its maritime activities from the 16th to the 19th century. Various exhibitions illustrate the world of fishing, shipping, shipping and other businesses in the region. The museum is open from Tuesday to Sunday for an entrance fee. Guided tours are available by reservation. Address: 4 Plaza Miguel Unamuno, Bilbao Cathedral of Santiago in Bilbao In the centre of the old city, Santiago Cathedral is a 19th century church built on the site of a 14th century pilgrimage shrine. Medieval Jacobean pilgrims on the road to Santiago stopped at the chapel on the way to Santiago de Compostela. The original church was damaged in 1571 by fire and rebuilt in the 19th century in the neo-Gothic style. Today, its melodic bells can be heard throughout Casco Viejo. The cathedral has a majestic interior, with three naves and vaulted ceilings. Particularly beautiful are the choir stands and the cloister with whimsical gothic details. The crypt incorporates the remaining structure of the original sanctuary. The cathedral is open to the public every day. Guided tours are available by appointment. Address: 1 Plazuela de Santiago, Bilbao Archaeology Museum Fernando Jiménez / modified photo Opened in 2008, the Bizkaia Museum of Archaeology allows visitors to discover the ancient history of the region and learn more about the differences between past and present. Located in the old town, the museum illustrates the evolution of Basque culture, from prehistoric times to recent times, with historical highlights through the centuries. The exhibits present fascinating archaeological objects from local excavations, which reveal insights into unique Basque culture, including pottery, ceramics and other objects. Other exhibits include fossils and other remains of prehistoric animals that once roed the area, including the Arrikruz Lion, a much larger animal than its current African cousins. The museum also houses educational programs that teach archaeological research and conservation methods. Address: 2 Calzadas de Mallona, Bilbao Doa Casilda Iturrazar Park, Filled with leafy palm trees and a splendid variety of colourful trees and flowers, the Doa Casilda Park offers a welcome respite from the city's urban hustle and bustle. This vast green space is beautifully landscaped in the romantic style. The winding trails encourage quiet walks, and and benches are well placed in shady places to take in the landscape. The park is adorned with neoclassical statues and beautiful fountains. The park's large lake is home to many ducklings and offers a charming place for rowing boats. Other highlights are the old-time merry-go-round, the open-air theatre, and a cybernetic fountain. The Museum of Fine Arts is located on the edge of the park beyond the street of Artetxe Kondearen Zumarkalea. Also nearby is the one-star Restaurant Aizian (29 Lehendakari Leizaola), which serves exquisite Spanish and Italian cuisine. The restaurant's elegant contemporary dining room offers magnificent views of the park. Location: Between Gran Vaa and Paseo de Abandoibarra, Bilbao Basilica de Begoa The district of Begoa is on a higher level above the old town. This picturesque hill is home to an important pilgrimage church, the Basilica of Begoa. Built in the 16th century, the church has an image of the Virgin of Begoa, patron saint of the city, and a beautiful painting of the pilgrimage of Begoa. The easiest way to get to the church is to take the elevator from behind the church of San Nicols. Another option is the trail, which requires a 20 minute walk to the top of the hill. From this point of view, visitors can enjoy an exceptional view of the city. Address: 38 Virgen de Begoa, Bilbao Museo Mariaino Raa de Bilbao Daniel Lobo / modified photo The Bilbao River Maritime Museum is near a dock in the Bilbao estuary on the site that was once the outbuildings of the Euskalduna shipyard. This unique museum immerses visitors in the world of navigation. The museum has an open-air exhibition area that includes docks, as well as restored ships. Inside the museum, exhibitions raise awareness of the environment of the Bilbao estuary, the history of the maritime industry and the traditions of people who have made a living from the estuary. The museum is open every day except Monday. Guided tours are available. Address: 1 Ramon de la Sota, Bilbao Euskalduna Music and Conference Hall The Euskalduna Music and Conference Hall is a superb modern structure built in 1999 and is considered one of the most important examples of contemporary architecture in Spain. The shape of the building was designed to imitate a ship, and symbolizes the last ship built at the Euskalduna shipyard. With 53,000 square metres of space, the building attracts crowds to the theatre for symphony, ballet and opera performances. Renowned for its exceptional acoustics, the theatre's auditorium is the largest stage in Spain and the second largest in Europe. The conference room of the building hosts many major conventions, cultural events and business meetings. The Exanobe restaurant, starred in the guide located in the Palacio Euskalduna complex is one of the highlights of foodies. The restaurant serves traditional Spanish cuisine in its elegant dining room or on the outdoor terrace; Both seats offer magnificent views of the city. City. 4 Avenida de Abandoibarra, Bilbao Mercado de la Ribera Built in 1929, this market is an ideal place to discover the daily life of Bilbao. The ribera market is located in the heart of the old town, where it attracts local buyers and restaurant chefs. The 10,000 square metre space is the largest internal market in Europe. Although the building was designed for functionality, the architecture features an eclectic style with a sense of openness. A bright and cheerful space, the market room has skylights above and a floor made of clear, translucent material that allows light to flood the building. The exterior features whimsical art deco designs, floral decorations and lattice windows. It is the best place in the city to find high quality Basque food products, fresh fruits and vegetables, seafood and other gourmet products used to prepare regional cuisine. For those who prefer to leave the kitchen to the experts, another of Bilbao's renowned gourmet restaurants is nearby. The Michelin-starred Mina restaurant is located on the Muelle Marzana along the shore, a short walk from the market. Address: Mercado de la Ribera, 22 bis Ribera, Bilbao Funicular d'Arxanda on Mount Artxanda Opened in 1915, this cable car, affectionately known as Funi, offers a wonderful way to take in the landscape of Bilbao. The funicular takes only three minutes to cross the hill in Aragoiti district to the top of Mount Artxanda, a truly rewarding destination. From the top, tourists are impressed by the stunning views of Bilbao's urban landscape. Around the top of Mount Artxanda are beautiful areas for taking a walk and admiring the views. The funicular runs daily, and trains depart every 15 minutes from the Plaza del Funicular (a 10-minute walk from City Hall). Plaza de Federico Moyua Photo Copyright: Stillman Rodgers More commonly referred to simply as the Gran Vaa, it is Bilbao's main thoroughfare, home to commercial and government buildings, as well as an abundance of restaurants and shops. It stretches for 1.5 kilometres from plaza circular (near the Maritime Museum) to the Plaza del Sagrado Corazon. On the way, it runs along the Don Casilda Park, then through the Plaza de Federico Moya in the Ensanche district, where the Chunar Palace is located. This attractive and lively area is a great place to admire more of the city's architecture while browsing the upscale boutiques and relaxing in a sidewalk café. Luxury Hotels: Located just across the Guggenheim, guests of Gran Hotel Domine Bilbao can admire Jeff Koons' puppy topiary day and night. This fashionable five-star hotel offers the best of modern luxury, with a design a panoramic roof terrace and glass bathrooms. The hotel's facilities include a restaurant, fitness centre and spa. The hotel's services include a small spa and an excellent restaurant with local produce, and amenities include a fitness center and free coffee in the lounge. Budget hotels: Casual Bilbao Gurea is an economical bed-and-breakfast with a central and picturesque location of the old town and friendly staff, offering immaculate rooms that are updated and bright, with private bathrooms. It's a great place for those travelling with children, offering family rooms, a dedicated game room, and even free child seats with bike hire. The four-foot children also welcome four-foot children. Bilbao City Rooms is a small budget hotel located in a central location near the Guggenheim and the Museum of Fine Arts. Although there are fewer bells and whistles, guests won't be disappointed-rooms are bright and comfortable with a crisp, modern style,

and include amenities like mini-refrigerators and microwaves. Sunny Santander: For those who visit the northern coast of Spain and hope to enjoy some sun, Santander is home to golden sandy beaches that are popular during the summer months. The small town is just over an hour's drive from Bilbao, and has many historical and cultural attractions, including the Museum of Prehistory and the Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art. Exploration of Oviedo: Further west along the coast, Oviedo is best known for the architecture and historical importance of its churches, including the Cathedral of Oviedo, as well as several fine examples of buildings from the 9th century to the Iglesia de Santa Maria del Naranco, Iglesia de San Julian de los Prados, and Iglesia San Tirso, among others.
